 Galaxy Z Flip 5 The Samsung Galaxy Z Flip 5 is the fifth generation of Samsung's compact foldable smartphone, released in August 2023. It builds upon its predecessor with key upgrades, including a larger cover screen and improved hinge design. Here's a detailed breakdown:

Display:

• Cover Screen: 3.4-inch Super AMOLED (upgraded from 1.9" on the Z Flip 4), supporting more widgets and apps.

Design:

- Hinge: New "Flex Hinge" reduces the crease and allows for a gapless fold.
- Colors: Mint, Graphite, Cream, Lavender, plus exclusive online colors (Gray, Blue, Green, Yellow).
