Cleveland Cavaliers (2023–Present)

- Signed a 3-year, \$26M deal to bolster bench scoring.

- 2023-24 Stats: 9.4 PPG, 37.6% 3PT, played all 82 games (rare durability).

Strengths & Weaknesses

Limitations in Playoffs

- Vs. Celtics (2024): Boston hunted him in switches (Tatum/Brown shot 62% when he was primary defender).
- Contract & Trade Value
- Deal: 3 years, \$26M (fully guaranteed in 2024-25; team option in 2025-26).
- Trade Scenario:
- Cavs could attach him as salary filler in a bigger deal (e.g., for a wing upgrade).
- Contenders might value him at \$8M/year if he's waived/bought out.

Comparison & NBA Archetype

- Ceiling Comp: Joe Ingles-lite (shooting, passing, defensive limitations).
- Floor Comp: Matt Bonner (elite spacer, minimal defense).

2012-2016 (Iowa State):

- Played as a point forward in Fred Hoiberg's "5-out" system
- Led NCAA in post-up efficiency (1.12 PPP) despite being 6'7"
- Developed Euro step before it was cool (coached by former Celtics guard Dana Barros)
- 2016-2018 (Pacers/G-League):
- Added push shot (5-10 foot floater) to combat NBA shot-blockers
- G-League stats: 28.3 PPG/6.7 RPG/4.1 APG in 2017 (but 29% usage → unsustainable for NBA role)

2018-2021 (Jazz):

- Quin Snyder turned him into a corner specialist (47% from corners in 2020)
- Learned to defend via "rear-view contesting" (jumping sideways to contest 3s without fouling)
- The Shooting Bible: NIANG's Unique Mechanics
- Release Point: 6'5" (unusually low for 6'7" – explains contestability)
