OnePlus 9T Mobile there is no official OnePlus 9T model. OnePlus typically follows a release pattern with numbered series (e.g., OnePlus 8, 9, 10) and sometimes adds "Pro" or "T" variants (like the OnePlus 8T). However, the OnePlus 9 series (2021) included:

- OnePlus 9 Pro
- OnePlus 9R (India-specific)

- Snapdragon 888+ (overclocked to 3.4GHz)
- 125W Hyper Charge (tested 0-100% in 12 minutes)
- Sony IMX789 + IMX766 dual main cameras (Hasselblad-tuned)
- Active liquid cooling (like gaming phones)
- But by June 2021, OPPO's merger forced OnePlus to kill the 9T and rebrand it as the China-exclusive 9RT—with downgraded specs.

Chapter 3: How to Resurrect the 9T in 2024
